Name: Ernest Gordon Adams

Date of birth: September 4, 1903

Date of death: March 19, 1973

Place of burial: St. Clements, Selkirk, Manitoba

Rank: CLP RF Man

Service: Royal Winnipeg Rifles

Location: London, England 1940 – 1945

Medals: Defense Medal, Volunteer Service Medal, War Medal 1939 – 1945

Other information: Ernest enlisted in Winnipeg, Manitoba in September 1939. He lied about his age; he was too old to serve. His age caught up with him in England. The army kept him in England for five years where he guarded the shores of England and rescued people in the rubble of Bombing of London, England.

Date of death: May 21, 1996

Place of burial: Calgary, Alberta, Canada.

Rank: Corporal, CLP

Medals: Canadian Korean Medal, Canadian Volunteer Service Medal Korea, United Nation Service Medal Korea, Korea Service Badge, Oak Leaf Mention in Dispatch MID

Service: Served with 4 th Canadian Guards he then went to Korea with this regiment. He remastered with Lord Strathcona Horse.

Name: William Charles Adams

Date of birth: June 7, 1922.

Date of death: June 8, 1944.

Place of burial: Ben-Sur-Mer, Canadian War Cemetery

Home: Selkirk, Manitoba, Canada

Rank: Private RF Man

Service: Royal Winnipeg Rifles

Medals: 1939 – 1945 Star, France and Germany Star, Volunteer Service Medal Defense Medal, War Medal 1939 – 1945

Other information: William enlisted in the army, Royal Winnipeg Rifles at the age of 17. William took part in D-Day, Normandy France invasion and was taken prisoner of war on June 8, 1944. While being a prisoner of war he was executed on June 8, 1944. William's mother, Mariam received the Silver Cross.

Date of death: September 28, 1916

Place of burial: Vimy Memorial France

Home: Selkirk, Manitoba, Canada

Rank: Private

Service: 1st Canadian Mounted Rifles

Medals: 1914 – 1915 Star, British War Medal Victory Medal 1914 – 1915, Memorial Plaque and Scroll

Other information: Served in the Middle Eastern theatre of World War 1. First saw action during the battle of Courcelette Belgium. He was killed in action on September 28, 1916. His parents received memorial plaque and scroll, King message "He died for Freedom and Honour".

Name: Percy Adams

Date of birth: June 30, 1897

Date of death: September 3, 1937

Place of burial: St. Clements, Selkirk, Manitoba

Home: Selkirk, Manitoba, Canada

Rank: Private

Service: Canadian Military Engineers

Medals: 1914 – 1915 Star, British War Medal Victory Medal

Other information: Percy died September 3, 1937, of complications from World I Percy had two sons who served in World War II, William Charles Adams served with Royal Winnipeg Rifles and was killed in action on June 8, 1944.

Clarence (Hootney) Adams served in Royal Canadian Regiment. World War II Korea, Germany, and Egypt 1956-1957.

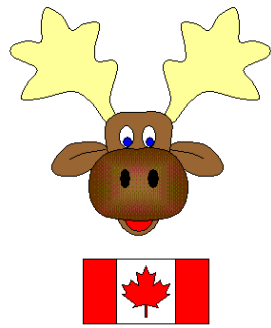
